

Self-Unpacking PDF Documents

This PDF is an example of a self-unpacking document. Under *Linux*, it can be viewed as a regular PDF using one of:

```
acroread self-unpacking.pdf
evince   self-unpacking.pdf
xpdf     self-unpacking.pdf
```

and its contents can be unpacked for the sake of typing one of:

```
perl -x self-unpacking.pdf -unpack
ruby -x self-unpacking.pdf -unpack
```

Before attempting to unpack this PDF, however, you should run:

```
gpg --verify self-unpacking.pdf
```

to make sure the PDF has not been tampered with. Even then you should only unpack the PDF if you trust *safety@amrita-ebook.org* not to send you a malicious file.
